### Who are we?

Caritas is the new social action and social justice agency of the Diocese of Shrewsbury which seeks to develop the Church's social mission in the years ahead.

Caritas actually means 'Christian love of humankind' and we express this in loving service. This is the motivation at the heart of all the work we do here at Caritas Shrewsbury.

### **Our story**

We encompass the work of the former Catholic Children's Society, and with the invaluable support from the diocesan-wide 'Our Mission Together' initiative, we have also extended our portfolio to include:

- intergenerational work
- young people at the risk of becoming homeless
- accessible community hubs
- work with those seeking refuge and asylum

### What we do

### **The School Project**

A dedicated team of experienced staff and volunteers including a social worker counsellors, with an excellent knowledge of local services and support networks, deliver this service working together with other agencies to provide a multiagency approach.

We work in schools to provide services to pupils and their families to assist with any difficulties they may be experiencing. The aims of the service are achieved through assessment of each pupil or family, evaluation, joint discussion and delivery of a package of tailored support. Staff have a range of skills and experience including:

- Evidence based Parenting Programmes
- Safeguarding
- SEN
- Bereavement
- Family Support

### St. Aidan's Centre, Wythenshawe

A centre of the community, the Centre is used on a regular basis by:

- groups supporting refugees
- · adults with special needs
- a group for families with toddlers
- people accessing the Food Bank / Community Café
- A Pipe Band and Morris Dancing for children
- the Iraqi Community
- a group addressing social isolation of the over 60s

### **Refugee Project**

Caritas Diocese of Shrewsbury has been



named by Bishop Mark as the coordinating point for Shrewsbury's response to the Refugee Crisis. In 2015 Pope Francis called attention to the plight of the people fleeing from Syria and he reminded us that we are all brothers and sisters, and we are called to take action and to 'Welcome the Stranger'. Caritas is responding by:

- Providing a safe space with advice, support and friendship at the Well Project.
- Supporting the Home Office resettlement programme called Community Sponsorship which some of our parishes are actively exploring with a view to supporting a family throughout their first couple of years in the UK.
- Raising awareness through school assemblies and talks in parishes and to groups.

2018 has so far been a very busy and rewarding year for us here at Caritas.

Our Refugee Project has been a huge success and we hope this year to expand it into other areas.

Our support staff have been working extremely hard with families within our communities around the Diocese who simply cannot cope with the problems that life throws at them, which may be due to a number of reasons both physical and emotional.

We are also excited to say our next project working with youth who are at risk of becoming homeless is now in the planning stage...more information to follow!
